And here is a newspaper report written by one of our Year 6 children, Korben. We wrote reports about a man called Philippe Petit, who walked a tightrope between the Twin Towers in Ney York city in 1974.

The man walked across the Twin Towers on a tightrope.



Where many people shop, eat and work, a fantastic daredevil life- threatening tightrope stunt was performed on a wire seven eighths of an inch thick, Philippe Petit risked his life.

It was August seventh, 1974, when thousands of people going on their daily walk or going to work saw a man performing dangerously on a thin piece of string as it appeared.

The time was 7:05, just after dawn, on a quiet Saturday morning. Office workers were stopped from going into their offices.

Police officer Bob has a speech he wants to say, "It was a very traumatic day everyone was shrieking or cheering him on. I had to stop people going into work and some of them obliged, which infuriated me, but then I said look up. They saw Philippe Petit dancing, running and even laying down on the wire It was the most extraordinary stunt I have ever seen in New York City."

It was an amazing day, which was absolutely jaw dropping day, with a dangerous stunt. It took an hour and a half for police and firefighters to get Mr Petit down from the wire to arrest him.

Some policemen even asked for his autograph, and he happily agreed to sign it for them. Even though he was arrested he was still smiling.

Here is a quote from Mr Petit himself: "I had lots of fun that day although I got arrested I felt a rush of adrenaline when I set foot on the wire. It took us one hour and forty-five minutes to get to the top. with lots of people cheering, it encouraged me to keep on going. I didn't plan to go across eight times."

Overall it was a hectic day for Manhattan, which people still love talking about today


